Britain's national museum of aviation, housing one of the world's finest collections of historic aircraft.

Large CP.

The museum has four big halls, and to see everything involves going a distance of up to 1km.

Flat entrance and step-free access almost everywhere, except to the flight simulator.

There's a gallery on the 1st floor where you can get a different view, reached by lift (D85 W140 L150) from near the entrance. There's a platform lift (D90 W90 L145) at the other end of the gallery to get down to the GF.

On the 3rd floor we saw a series of video presentations, with plenty of room for chair users.

The Milestones Hall links directly into the Bomber Hall and then into the Historic Hangars.

The *Wings Restaurant* and Battle of Britain Hall are on the other side of the CP area.

There are **wheelchair/adapted toilets**:

- by the lift, with access both from the main entrance hall and from Milestones, **(D85 ST70)** with BCF, and there's a separate BCF;
- between the Bomber Hall and the Historic Hangars, next to the mens, **(D80 ST55)** with BCF;
- by the *Wings Restaurant* **(D90 ST90 but with an inward opening door)**.
